"She is a driven and determined scholar," said Connellan of Howe, who has maintained a cumulative weighted GPA of 109.44.

Statkevich is also a member of the National Honor Society and has maintained a cumulative weighted GPA of 108.534.

"Alex is viewed by faculty as a consummate student," said Connellan, who said he has excelled in many Advanced Placement courses.

With an interest in science and dentistry, he has completed more than 80 hours of shadowing in general dentistry and oral surgery and was selected to participate in the University of Connecticut's High School Mini Medial and Dental Medical program.

At SHS, Statekevich is active in the music program. He is a four-year member of the marching band, a brass captain this year, and a member of the jazz ensemble, jazz combo, brass music ensemble, and "Surround Sound Band."
